Nectarines

FANTASIA ON LOVELL CERTIFIED: Large freestone fruit with smooth skin; 70% bright red overlaid on brilliant yellow. Firm, smooth textured, yellow flesh of excellent quality. **Self-fertile.**

RED GOLD ON LOVELL CERTIFIED: High-yielding; uniformly large fruit. Blemish free red fruit. Good size if properly thinned. Firm and juicy. Excellent color and flavor. High quality. Holds its firmness during storage/shipping. **Self-fertile.**

ROOTSTOCK DESCRIPTION: LOVELL: Good anchorage & vigor. Prefers well drained loam soil. Sensitive to wet feet or heavy soils. Very little suckering.

Pear

BARTLETT PEAR ON PYRO 2-33: Leading pear for canning and fresh market sales. Large, golden yellow fruit with a slight blush. Smooth, juicy, tender white flesh. **Partially self-fruitful.**

COLUMBIA RED D'ANJOU PEAR ON OHXF: this sport of the commercially important D'Anjou is similar to its parent in shape, flesh-coloring, texture and flavor; however the fruit's skin has a deep red surface color.

PEAR ROOTSTOCK DESCRIPTION: PYRO 2-33: Semi-dwarf rootstock with good soil adaptation. Has good root anchorage with an excellent root system. Moderate to tolerant resistance to Fireblight, no root suckering. Good winter cold hardiness and excellent precocity and yield efficiency. Similar to OHxF87. **OHxF SERIES**: Rootstocks originated from crosses made more than 75 years ago at Oregon State. Seeking stock resistant to fire blight.

Apples

CRIPPS PINK LADY ®: Attractive pink blush over a yellow undertone. Fruit often displays ribbing or a bumpy skin, but remains appealing to consumers. Medium to large sized and oblong, fruit has a crisp texture and dense, cream-colored flesh. Flavor is tart-sweet with an excellent sugar to acid balance. Full flavor is developed after about four weeks in storage and storage life is long. Tree is vigorous with large leaves; matures later than most varieties.

FIRESTORM HONEYCRISP: This blush strain has higher color than the original honeycrisp. Skin is 2/3 mottled red over a yellow background. Flesh is cream-colored with exceptionally crips and juicy texture, sub-acid flavor and mild aroma. High quality apple which keeps well for 5-6 months in common storage. Tree is vigorous and hardy.

AZTEC FUJI: Full colored, blush type that harvests late season with standard Fuji. Tree is healthy and vigorous; fruit exhibits traditional sweet flavor of Fuji.

ROOTSTOCK BUD 118: (Budagovsky118) Similar in size to EMLA 106 and 111 or approx. 95% of seedling. Very winter hardy and adaptable to a wide range of soils. Resistant to collar rot. Reported to be as precocious as EMLA 106 and is recommended for production in cold climates as well as under replant conditions.

Freestone Peaches

GIANT BABCOCK (WHITE) ON LOVELL CERTIFIED: White medium size fruit with a red blush, with almost fuzzless skin and white flesh. Flesh is tender, very juicy and sweet, semi-freestone flesh turns red around the pit with good quality, aromatic flavor. It is mild, with low acid. Ripens two weeks before Elberta. **Self-pollinating.**

FLAVORCREST ON LOVELL CERTIFIED: Ripens around the same time as Redhaven. Fruit is large, round, semi-freestone with a yellow flesh that is exceptionally firm, smooth-textured and highly-flavored. The exterior color is bright red over a bright yellow ground color. Appears to be winter bud hardy. Heavy fruit set.

SUNCREST ON LOVELL CERTIFIED: Large, round freestone, attractive that colors to about 80% bright red blush over yellow background. Flesh is yellow and exceptionally firm with good texture and flavor. Vigorous, self-fruitful, productive trees have a good hardiness record where tested in Eastern sites.

SIERRA LADY ON LOVELL CERTIFIED: A sport of the O'Henry peach. Has a prime pick time between Elegant Lady and O'Henry. (AUGUST 1) It has excellent flavor and texture, full red from base to tip, round shape with depressed tip. This freestone is an excellent freezer peach and holds up well in shipping.

FAY ELBERTA ON LOVELL CERTIFIED: Large, yellow skin freestone with little red blush, that has fairly good shape and good flavor. Flesh is yellow, fine-grained with good firmness. Similar to Elberta, but blooms earlier and ripens 1 to 6 days after Elberta. A shipping and canning variety for California.

PEACH ROOTSTOCK DESCRIPTION: LOVELL: Good anchorage & vigor. Prefers well drained loam soil. Sensitive to wet feet or heavy soils. Very little suckering.

Cling Peaches

LOADEL ON LOVELL: High quality canning peach, Firm, excellent color, exhibits uniform ripening. Sizes well for an extra early.

Cherries

BING ON KRYMSK ® **5**: Fruit is very large, dark mahogany to black, attractive; one of the finest commercial sweet cherries. One of the best shipping and fresh market varieties as well as commercial canning. Flesh very solid, reddish-purple, flavor of the highest quality, firm and juicy. **Requires a pollinizer.**

BROOKS ON KRYMSK-5: Large, uniform oblate dark red fruit. Flesh is firm and crisp with variable shades of red and pink. Stone is nearly free. Flavor is superior to Early Burlat and is sweet, rich, well-balanced and exceptional for early season maturity.

LAPINS ON KRYMSK-5: Large, highly split resistant, **self-fertile** cherry. Fruit is dark red, with lighter red flesh. Harvests two weeks after Bing. Tree is cold hardy and an excellent pollinizer.

RAINIER ON MAZZARD: Large, yellow fruit with a red blush similar to Royal Ann. Firm, clear to light yellow flesh. Fine-textured and distinct flavor. Vigorous, upright spreading tree, Early bearing, Very productive, Ripens mid-season.

BLACK TARTARIAN ON MAZZARD: Very large, heart shaped fruits vary from bright purplish-black to red skin with sweet, red rich juicy flesh. Remarkably vigorous tree is an erect grower and immense bearer. Mainly used a pollinizer for most varieties. Excellent for home orchard.

CHERRY ROOTSTOCK DESCRIPTION: KRYMSK ® 5: Reduces tree size by 20% to 30% compared to those grown on Mazzard. Non-suckering trees. The rootstock is precocious and compatible with all cherries. Sensitive to Prunus ringspot & Prunus dwarf virus.

MAZZARD: Excellent anchorage. Many shallow roots may become injured by deep cultivation and drought. Sandy loam to loam. More tolerant of heavy soils. Makes a very large tree; cold hardy. Has root suckers. Common rootstock for cherry trees in Washington State.

Apricots

PATTERSON ON LOVELL: Ripens approx. 10 days before Tilton and is a heavy producer. Good for canning, freezing, drying and fresh market. Exceptional canning characteristics and flavor. Large, highly-colored fruit with firm flesh. Uniform ripening pattern makes it well-suited for mechanical harvesting. High crop load that resists fruit dropping. Ripens approximately mid-June.

LORNA ON M-40 MARIANNA: Deep orange-colored apricot, twice as big as Castlebrite. Fruit is freestone, with pit held tightly between fruit cheeks. Fruit flesh is dense, juicy and finely textured. Potential for fruit cracking-most severe when rainfall occurs during the period immediately before harvest. Ripens mid to late May.

APRICOT ROOTSTOCK DESCRIPTION: LOVELL: Good anchorage & vigor. Prefers well drained loam soil. Sensitive to wet feet or heavy soils. Very little suckering.

APRICOT ROOTSTOCK DESCRIPTION: <u>M40 MARIANNA</u>: Observed that Marianna M40 has good wet soil tolerance, with potential for better anchorage and reduced sucker production.

Plum

MARIPOSA PLUM ON M-40 MARIANNA: Large plums with nearly freestone red flesh and a small pit. Glossy maroon over green skin. Sweet, juicy, firm and delicious with pleasantly tart skin. Low chill hours, good choice for milder climates. Also known as Improved Satsuma. **Pollinated by Beauty, Nubiana, Late Santa Rosa, Shiro or Burbank plums.**

SANTA ROSA ON M-40 MARIANNA: Superior, quality flesh makes Santa Rosa the most widely grown plum. Purple-red skin surrounds rich, tart, fragrant, yellow flesh. Prolific, vigorous, self-fertile. Low chill.

PLUM ROOTSTOCK DESCRIPTION: M40 MARIANNA: Observed that Marianna M40 has good wet soil tolerance, with potential for better anchorage and reduced sucker production.

Almonds

NONPAREIL ON LOVELL CERTIFIED: The premier variety in California. It blooms approximately the 3rd week in February; harvests at the end of August. Kernel is medium-large size with excellent quality and flavor, and flat which is in high demand by the trade. It has become the basis of the almond industry. Shell is paper thin, often poorly sealed. Tree is large and harvest easily.

NEPLUS ON LOVELL CERTIFIED: Blooms 5 days before Nonpareil; harvests 14 days after Nonpareil. Early bloom is susceptible to frost. The kernel is large; shell is soft and well sealed. Tree has a spreading, slightly willow-like growth habit. Use primarily for pollination.

Dwarf Citrus Trees - Limit 2 trees per customer

WASHINGTON NAVAL ORANGE: California's famous winter-ripening variety. Sweet, seedless fruit ripens in ten months

MEYER LEMON: Very juicy, not as tart as Eureka. Prolific bearer nearly year-round; heaviest in winter. Mature fruit takes on a golden hue.

BEARSS LIME: True Lime. Fruit larger than Mexican lime. Good in cool areas. Year round.

BLUEBERRIES 2-GALLON: Requires abundant light, good air circulation. Planting area 2 ft. in diam. 1 foot deep; remove 1/3 to 1/2 soil, add e
