Fruit/Nut	Variety	Description
Almond	All-in-One on Rootpac-R	All-in-One almond is the most popular almond for home orchards. Heavy crops of soft-shell nuts with sweet, flavorful kernels. Self-fruitful.
Almond	Nonpareil on Krymsk 86	The premier variety in California. Kernel is medium-large size with excellent quality and flavor. Shell is paper thin.
Walnut	Chandler on Clonal RX1	Harvests mid-season; large smooth oval nut and high quality kernel. Medium size, highly productive tree.
Walnut	Robert Livermore on Clonal RX1	The Robert Livermore has a patented red-kernel. The harvest date is around the first week of October. It has a medium to high yield. Nut is medium to small and round.
Olive	Coratina	Vigorous tree to 30'. Beautiful gray-green color. Large fruit. Needs a pollinator. This olive has a naturally high level of polyphenols, which yield a robust tasting olive oil. Origin: Italy, Croatia
Olive	Manzanillo	A large tree, 25'-30', with purple-green skin. "Manzanillas" means little apples in Spanish. Known for a rich taste and thick pulp, it is a prolific bearer, grown around the world. Origin: Spain
Apple	Aztec Fuji on Geneva41	Outstanding and consistent red blush coloring. Sweet, juicy flavor of traditional Fuji. Tree is healthy and vigorous. Harvests late season with standard Fuji.
Apple	Granny Smith on Geneva 969	Very large, round to slightly conical green fruit. Excellent tart flavor. Flesh is white with texture that is fine grained and firm. A good all-purpose apple with excellent storage life. Harvest in late September to early October. Pollinizer recommended.
Apple	Royal Red Honeycrisp on Geneva890	Similar to its parent, the famous Honeycrisp Apple, the Royal Red Honeycrisp is more uniformly red, sweeter, and has better storage capacity than its parent.
Apricot	Katy on M-40	Nice, sweet apricot with large size fruit. This is a very productive variety. Harvests about 3 weeks before Royal Blenheim.
Blueberries	To Be Determined	
Cherry	Coral Champagne on Colt	Large, firm fruit with a rich glossy red wine finish. Ripens 7 to 10 days before Bing. Trees are very precocious and fruit has low susceptibility to rain cracking. Flavor is truly exceptional.
Cherry	Lapins on Mazzard	Large, highly split-resistant, self-fertile cherry. The fruit is dark red, with lighter red flesh. It harvests two weeks after Bing. Tree is cold hardy and an excellent pollinizer.
Nectarine	Fantasia on Rootpac-R	Large freestone fruit with smooth skin; 70% bright red overlaid on brilliant yellow. Firm, smooth textured, yellow flesh of excellent quality. Self-fertile.
Nectarine	Panamint on Krymsk86	Red-skinned with yellow flesh. Great balance of acid in this fruit, with both tart and sweet notes.
Nectarine	Snow Queen on Krymsk86	White nectarine with a red skin. Freestone. The fruit is sweet and juicy, with a nice balancing acid.
Peach - Freestone	Desert Gold on Rootpac-R	Heat tolerant. Yellow color. Medium size fruit. Ripens in early July. Sweet taste and firm texture. Good for warm weather. Semi-freestone. Self-pollinating.
Peach - Freestone	Gleason Elberta on Bailey	Medium to large size fruit; oblong. Skin is bright gold with little or no red blush; flesh is yellow with no red around pit. Freestone. Firm texture, excellent quality. Great for canning, fresh use, and freezing.
Peach - Freestone	Glowingstar FA17 on Krymsk86	A large peach that is 70% bright red with a yellow background. The fruit is firm, yellow and non-browning. Glowingstar® is completely freestone and hangs well on the tree even when it is completely ripe.
Peach - Freestone	Tropic Snow on Rootpac-R	Freestone white peach. This variety has a nice balanced blend of acid and sugar. It harvests early.

Prune	Denny Prune on Krymsk86	Blooms 10-14 days before French. Slightly smaller fruit size compared to French, very uniform.
